The Bible lists a series of contrasts between choices that must be made: two gates, two roads, two types of trees, two houses, and two foundations. Psalm 1 is the clearest, more carefully developed, and first full expression of this concept in God's Word. This psalm is given to challenge you to live a godly life and to remind you of the consequences of the wicked lifestyle.

What does this psalm teach you about prayer?

- I. This psalm shows you how prayer can enable you to live a godly life. This psalm shows you how prayer is essential to living a godly life.
 - 1. When you pray, express your commitments to the Lord.
 - 2. When you pray, express your contentment in the Lord.
 - 3. When you pray, express your confidence in the Lord.
 - a. God will judge the wicked.
 - b. God will bless the righteous.
- II. This psalm gives you a dynamic model for praying for the lost.
 This psalm provides you with some powerful points to plead in behalf of those who need Jesus.
 - 1. Pray that this person will see how blessed a godly person is.
 - 2. Plead that this person will see the uselessness of a wicked lifestyle.
 - 3. Ask that this person will be convicted about the certainty of judgment.
 - 4. Pray that the person will see the deceptive and destructive power of sin.
 - 5. Plead that this person will know how great God is.
- III. This psalm reveals your need to adore God's righteousness.
 This psalm exalts the righteousness of God. This psalm offers you much to adore and honor God's righteousness.
